Life Comes “Full Circle”

From Full Circle Adopted Infant to Full Circle Intern

Hello! My name is Kianna Romano, and I was adopted through Full Circle Adoptions seventeen years ago. Because of FCA I was able to be adopted from a teen mother in Idaho into my loving family in Massachusetts. My adoption has shaped the type of person I am and the person I want to be. I am incredibly grateful for my birthparents decision to put me up for adoption. I cannot imagine how difficult it was for them to place me with another family. At the same time, I am blessed to be a part of my adoptive family, who has raised me with incredible love, support, and opportunities.

Traveling and helping others has played a major role in my life since I was young. When I was 13, I began traveling to developing countries on community service trips. My first trip to Haiti was the most influential trip I have ever taken. I worked in clinical facilities, aided small isolated villages, and provide care to the elderly. However, the most important part of this trip occurred in the orphanages. In the orphanages, I once held an abandoned baby who was sick with a rare and deadly disease. Although I was only with him for an hour, he had a major impact on my life.

I remember that while I was holding him he kept looking at me with his big brown eyes; simple acts of love and care like this were rare for him and I could see how appreciative he was. When I put him back into his crib all I could hear was his crying. At that moment I realized how much I wanted to help children because so many of them never have a chance to thrive; I want to help in any way possible, just like how FCA helped my family and me.

Later, I returned to Haiti, focused on working with orphans; next, I flew to Nepal to work on an Earthquake disaster relief program; and, most recently, I went to Costa Rica and worked in an orphanage with newborns and infants. These trips made me realize I wanted to pursue a career in adoption. Whether they are international or domestic, I want to help provide children with opportunities they wouldn't otherwise have. I want to take part in changing their lives.

This realization motivated me to find an opportunity where I could continue helping children and families, alike, closer to home. Since pursuing an internship at Full Circle Adoptions I have been able to learn what it's like to work at an adoption agency.

I have loved my experience interning with FCA and am excited to say that I have come “Full Circle” because of them. I went from being adopted, to working for the same people who placed me with the people who have enabled me explore the world, offered me opportunities, and who have enriched my life – my forever family. So, thanks FCA! Thank you for helping my parents adopt me and thank you for the opportunity to help other children and adoptive families as an intern.
