These days I love getting up early enough for some morning time, especially when Lysander is here and we just chill side by side, slowly waking up (I have to wake VII up or they would sleep until noon!). I make a hot breakfast for the kids every day before getting them off to school. I'm glad I determine my own work hours as a carpenter, because I can always be home with my kids if they don't have school or wake up sick. I am glad I will be able to spend quality time with a newborn, bonding with them in their first few years.

From Natasha: A real sweetheart, Cory is a gentle guy who loves shepherding his kids through the world. **He is deeply kind and practices patience daily.** Cory has an unspoken do-no-harm philosophy you can feel in his words and actions. Even if he's frustrated, he won't blame others for his experience. I have never felt safer with anyone than I do with him. We love him to pieces! But you don't have to take my word for it...
